Branwell Bronte plaque and garden

One of the Group's main projects during 2013 has been to promote the local connection with Branwell Bronte – brother of the three famous Bronte sisters. Branwell was employed as Assistant Clerk-in-Charge at Sowerby Bridge's first railway station from its opening in October 1840 until March 1841.

An English Heritage style blue plaque has been fixed to the outside wall of the Jubilee Refreshment Rooms to commemorate this connection (see picture opposite).

The newly created 'Bronte Garden' is also part of this initiative, the intention being that it contains plants and flowers mentioned in the various Bronte novels, poems, paintings and drawings.

Recent planting in the Bronte Garden has included roses; heathers; crocus; strawberries; hawthorn; box and bay tree – all of which feature in the Bronte works.



Winter changeover of plants

Saturday, 16 November, saw the winter changeover of plants/flowers in the locally sponsored station planters and tubs. This involved the removal of summer varieties and replacement pack bedding (primula, pansy, viola, bellis, wallflower); winter heathers; ivy; hawthorn and skimmia.

Security mirrors

In mid-November, the long awaited replacement security mirrors were installed in the station's underpass. These have been positioned at the bottom of the slopes from the platforms to give added vision and security for station users. The Group thanks Northern Rail for providing and fixing these.

Former Sowerby Bridge Railway Station Workers

Derek Ashton (1957-1960)

Derek worked as a Booking Office Clerk at Sowerby Bridge Railway Station from 1957 to 1960 and was a Relief Clerk at other local stations covering holidays, staff absences and busy parcel periods. His job involved selling tickets, dealing with parcels, answering the telephone, answering Morse Code messages and paying the workers' wages.

He was commended by British Railways' Leeds Area Manager during the severe winter weather of 1959 when, together with the Station Foreman Stanley Millward, he cleared the points at Milner Royd Junction – Derek recollects using a flame thrower to free the frozen points. As a reward for this work he received a one day holiday and a free travel pass to any British Railways' station (He travelled to Elgin in Scotland). Derek also recollects assisting with the delivery of trunks from Sowerby Bridge Station to Rishworth School, at the beginning of the school year, with the parcel van driver Jack.

At Derek's time at the station Leonard Hopkinson was the Chief Clerk and Tom E Smith was the Stationmaster. There were 40-50 people employed at Sowerby Bridge Station and Engine Shed at that time.

After leaving British Railways in 1960, Derek worked at the District Bank in Hebden Bridge and became the Bank Manager of Nat West in Heckmondwike in 1980. He retired in 2004 and currently lives in Brighouse with his wife Pamela and his classic cars.
